Last week you completed a multiple choice questionnaire on pedestrian road safety habits.

Have a look at your scores from last week and compare with the information below. Then answer the relevant question.

**Mostly A's** You have some good road safety skills and knowledge. Generally speaking, you aren't a risk taker and you do make decisions to try and keep you and your friends safer. However, sometimes you lack confidence or can make hasty decisions that could lead to an accident – even though you probably know there's a safer way of doing things.

**Question:** How could you prioritise your safety? (and the safety of your friends) Write down 1 example

**Mostly B's** You make lots of decisions in the heat of the moment, sometimes based on what you think your friends want you to do. You often fail to think about your personal safety and that of the people around you. Time to take control and stay out of danger. What's stopping you? Don't risk having to look back with hindsight from a hospital bed and wish you'd done things differently.

**Question:** What could you do to improve your road safety knowledge and put it into practice? Write down 2 ways you could be safer

**Mostly C's** You're happy to speak up if you think someone's behaviour could be putting you or your friends in danger. This will mean you're a trusted friend, even if people don't always say so. You also have good road safety skills which means you are happily and safely able to navigate your way around.

**Question:** How can you use your knowledge to encourage your friends and family to do the same? Give an example






## Fatalities by road user type

## Fatalities by region


