Martin Luther King

Read the information:

Martin Luther King was a Christian. He became a Minister in Alabama, America. From an early age he was aware that black people were not treated as equal citizens in America.

Black people earned half that of the average white man, they could not vote, they lived in poor areas and were **segregated** (separated in public places).

Martin Luther King strongly believed the only way to achieve equal rights of black people in America was through non-violent means and peaceful forms of protest.

His Christian beliefs told him that violence and hatred could only be conquered by love and forgiveness.
