In addition to these online activities it is essential that children complete the following activities this week;

English

1. Complete a 'Sound Treasure Hunt' with your child - look for letters around your house (books, food cans, toy labels etc). Encourage your child to tell you what these letters are and then copy these onto paper.

Things to look for;

- Is your child holding their pencil correctly?
- Can your child use the words in a sentence (verbally) or write these sentences with adult support?
- Complete this activity twice – really try to develop your child's vocabulary by describing items, eg. the silver metal spoon.



Maths

1. Capacity – filling and emptying
Pour water into different cups and containers during bath time and estimate how many small containers of water will fit into one bigger container.



2. Collect ten household items. Ask your child to put them into groups, those they think will float and those that they think will sink. Try this out in the bath. Take a photograph or draw the results to show your findings.
