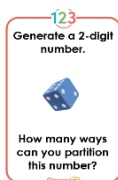

Maths



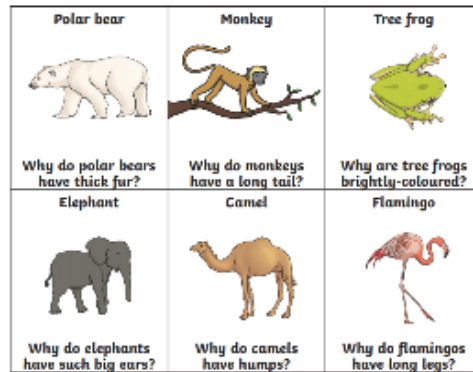
1. Find a dice from one of your games at home.

4. Complete these steps until you have made ten 2-digit numbers.
5. Which is the smallest number?
6. Which is the biggest number?
7. Can you write these numbers in order – you may need a grown up to help you with this.
