everyone involved.


A big thank you to Mr Starks and Miss Vandepeer for organising such a brilliant day.


The next Senior rewards afternoon takes place on Tuesday 29th March. Pupils will get more activities to choose from based on their work ethic and behaviour around school.

Squirrels—Maidstone Leisure Centre Activity Day


Squirrels have been having swimming lessons this term and have been making great progress because they have been listening well to instructions and putting in a lot of effort.

Recipe to Try at Home Papeton (French Style Potato Rosti) This is a very easy recipe for the whole family to make and eat together Enjoy! Equipment you will need: Grater, Tea Cloth, Mixing Bowl, Measuring Spoons, Wooden Spoon, Non-Stick Frying Pan, Spatula & Plate Ingredients: Makes 1 1 Small Potato 1 Small Courgette 4 Spring Onions 1 Teaspoon Herbes de Provence 2 Tablespoons Flour ½ Teaspoon Salt 1 Egg 2 Tablespoons Oil Method Put the tea cloth on the worktop and then grate the courgette and potato into the centre Gather the corners of the tea cloth and squeeze the liquid out over the sink Put the potato and courgette into a mixing bowl Finely chop the spring onions and add to the bowl Add the ½ teaspoon of salt, 1 teaspoon of herbs, 2 tablespoons of flour and the egg then mix well Put 1 tablespoon oil into a frying pan and heat Once it is hot add the potato mixture—squash it down into a circle to about 2cm thick there should be a gap around the edge of the pan Turn the heat to the lowest setting Loosen the Papeton from the frying pan with a spatula Turn the plate upside down on the pan and turn the pan over so the Papeton falls onto the plate Add the 2nd tablespoon of oil to the pan and heat 12. Slide the Papeton into the frying pan to cook the other side Enjoy These can be enjoyed with a breakfast or dinner! 88888888


Message from Buzz


