Recipe to Try at Home Macaroni Cheese

Equipment you will need:

Scales, 2 Saucepans, Whisk, Measuring Jug, Palette Knife, Tablespoon, Teaspoon, Wooden Spoon, Cheese Grater, 2 Plates, Colander, Oven–Proof Serving Dish

Ingredients: Makes enough for 4

- * 600ml Milk
- * 60g Margarine or Butter
- * 60g Plain Flour
- * 1/2 Teaspoon Mustard
- * 60g Cheese (plus extra cheese for the top)
- * 200g Macaroni

Method

- 1. Cook the macaroni in a saucepan as per the instructions on the packet and drain through the colander
- 2. Grate cheese onto a plate
- 3. In a saucepan melt the butter add the flour stirring all the time and then add the milk a little at a time until all added
- 4. Keep stirring all the time until thickened
- 5. Stir in the cheese until it has melted
- 6. Add the cooked pasta and cook until heated through
- 7. Season with salt and pepper
- 8. Pour into the Oven Proof Dish
- 9. Add extra grated cheese on the top and bake in the oven until golden

Additions:

- \ast Add cooked chopped bacon before pouring in the Dish
- * Add sliced tomato to the top before putting it in the oven
- * Add a tin of white crab meat in the sauce
- * Add cooked pieces of chicken
