# ENGLISH

# **DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY**

Within Design and Technology this term Year 8 have been generating, developing and producing a Hand Steady Game with L.E.D's and a buzzer.

They have been learning about how electrical circuits work with regard to inputs, processes and output components whilst developing skills in cutting and stripping wires, soldering and vacuum forming in order to create their final piece .



# Year 11 College

This term 11L returned to Rowhill School taking part in carpentry, motor mechanics and cycle maintenance. This was after last term's special block of lessons learning about stage and screen make up. Any fears that the pupils had, that they were going to learn about "pretty" make up were



soon dispelled. The college tutor, who has worked in both stage and screen worked with the Year II's to produce fake, cuts, bruises, and gunshot wounds. Some of the wounds have looked so realistic that the accompanying Bower Grove Staff have felt a little queasy at times.

11K this term have returned to Mid Kent College Maidstone and are taking part in the multi skill carrousel of lessons, having a go at painting and decoration, plastering, and bricklaying.

After the May half term 11k will return to Rowhill and IIL will return to Mid Kent College Maidstone for their last few sessions be for leaving Bower Grove.

### Artrepreneur Enterprise Programme Showcase

On Monday 16th May our Year 11 pupils held an event in school which allowed them to showcase their work and all that they have achieved over the past year whilst undergoing the Artrepreneur Enterprise Programme or AEP for short.

At the start of the year pupils chose to follow the AEP with either an Art or a Music focus. Throughout the year in Art pupils created a collage, experienced mono printing for the first time and printed some London monuments as well as diving into the work of Banksy. In Music, pupils took part in workshops for Keyboard, Guitar, Tab Reading, Music Technology, Live Sound and Sound Engineering before learning about songs by The Beatles.

The showcase was a great success with many parents and pupils from other classes coming to admire the artwork and listen to the pupil music playing in the background. The event


concluded with a live performance of 'Saw Her Standing There' by The Beatles. All the pupils should be extremely proud of their work and for helping organise such a lovely event.

A huge well done to all year 11 pupils who have completed their qualifications this term and to those busy completing their GCSE exams throughout May and June.

There has been lots of practical work happening in the lab this term – KS3 pupils have been testing reactivity of substances and investigating forces and year 10 have completed electrolysis.



### Year 6 Residential

The trip started with a visit to Wildwood Animal Park, where pupils bravely walked across a rope bridge above the bear enclosure. # Recipe to Try at Home Coronation Chicken

#### Ingredients:

#### Makes enough for 4

- \* 2 Chicken Breasts—skin removed
- \* 1 tbsp Oil
- 1 Unwaxed Lemon (Zest & Juice)
- \* Knob of Butter
- \* 1 Shallot (Finely Chopped)
- \* 1 Red Chilli (Deseeded & Finely Chopped
- \* 2 tsp Madras Curry Powder
- \* 2 tbsp Tomato Puree
- \* 100ml/3½ fl oz Dry White Wine
- \* 100ml/3½ fl oz Chicken Stock
- \* 1 tbsp Apricot Jam
- \* 150ml/5 fl oz Mayonnaise
- \* 75ml/3 fl oz Crème fraîche
- \* 1 Large Mango (Peeled, Stone Removed & Flesh Diced)
- 5 Spring Onions (Finely Chopped)
- \* 2 tbsp Finely Chopped Fresh Coriander
- Dash of Tabasco Sauce
- \* Salt & Freshly Ground Black Pepper
- \* Green Salad Leaves
- \* 50g/2 oz Flaked Almonds (Lightly Toasted in a Dry Frying Pan)

#### Method

- 1. Rub the olive oil all over the chicken. Scatter over the lemon zest and season with salt & pepper.
- 2. Steam the chicken for 20-25 mins or until cooked through. Set aside to cool.
- 3. Melt the butter in a frying pan, add the shallot and chilli and cook for 5 mins. Stir in the curry powder and cook for 2–3 mins. Stir in the tomato puree and cook for a further minute. Add the wine and simmer until the volume of the liquid has reduced by half.
- 4. Stir in the jam and stock and simmer until the volume of the liquid has reduced by half. Set aside to cool.
- 5. Mix the mayonnaise and the crème fraîche together in a bowl, then stir in the curry dressing. Fold in the mango, spring onions, lemon juice and coriander.
- 6. Cut the chicken into bite-sized pieces. Fold into the curry dressing and season with salt, pepper and Tabasco to taste. Serve with a green salad and scatter with the toasted almond flakes.
