



Year 7 Acids and Alkalis, Energy Transfers




Year9 Forces & Motion, Atomic Structure and the Periodic Table






Year 8 Fluids, Plants and their Reproduction





Satellite

Satellite have been busy this term getting ready for the Christmas festivities. In between play rehearsals, hoop decorating and art activities the children have been developing their writing skills; Year 6 have created newspaper reports and Years 4 and 5 have created non-chronological reports. They have all been checking that they are using the features needed for their particular writing genre. In Science we have been



growing our own bacteria and exploring gases, liquids and solids.

Swimming

This year, Swimming is back for key stage 2 and 3 pupils. Each class will go to Maidstone Leisure Centre for a term each and practice their strokes and water safety. We are delighted to have Swimming back on the curriculum and that pupils have the chance to go offsite and develop their skills. So far, Penguins and Falcons have successfully enjoyed a term each on a Thursday and 8V and 8F on a Tuesday



After weeks of learning skills and working hard, the pupils then get a chance to show how far they can swim. Pupils are given a certificate with their distance at the end of term in assembly. The classes so far have shown great maturity and work ethic throughout their lessons. Next term, the two classes Swimming will be Squirrels and 9L.

Rona Sailing Trip

In October a number of year 11 pupils attended a four-night sailing residential, organised and led by the Rona Sailing Trust. On Monday morning eleven pupils (Mr Jacobs, Mr Lawrence, Miss Percival and Miss Quinn) took the minibus to Southampton docks where they were met by the sailing team. The group were then divided across two 80ft sailing boats named Donald Searle and Rona II.



The Bower Grove pupils were all shown necessary team-

work skills to sail the boat safely and within the next three hours had arrived at the Isle of Wight. All cooking and cleaning was done by the pupils, with some staff guidance. Over the next four days the boat was sailed to Portsmouth and back to complete a full lap of the Isle of Wight.

Great fun was had by all involved and the Rona Sailing Team were, again, highly impressed with the pupils, commenting that they were one of the best groups they have had. It was especially pleasing to hear that some of the sailing crew specifically request to attend the annual Bower Grove trip as they like working with the pupils; which is feedback we have now had for consecutive years.

Recipe to Try at Home Stained Glass Christmas Biscuits

Ingredients:

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- 175g Plain Flour
- 1159 Block Margarine
- 125g Caster Sugar
- Bag of Boiled Sweets



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Equipment Needed:

Scales, Mixing Bowl, Pallet Knife, Tablespoon, Wooden Spoon, Rolling Pin, Medium Round or Star Cutter, Mini Christmas Cutters, Baking Tray, Greaseproof Paper, Cooling Rack and a Straw

Method:

- Set Oven to Gas 4 or Electric 180° 1.
- Line the baking tray with a sheet of greaseproof paper
- Cut the margarine into small pieces and add to the mixing bowl 3.
- Add the sugar and cream until light and fluffy
- Add the flour and bring the mixture together to make a ball of dough—if your mixture is a little too dry add a tablespoon of milk until dough begins to form
- Lightly flour work surface and roll out the dough until the thickness of a £1 coin
- Using the round or star cutter cut out rounds and place on baking tray 7.
- With the smaller Christmas cutters stamp out the middle of the biscuit and remove—place to one side
- Place a boiled sweet into the middle of each biscuit 9.
- Using the end of the straw, stamp out a small hole near the top of each biscuit
- Bake for 15-20 minutes until they are a golden colour 11.
- When cooked remove from oven and leave to cool until the sweets have hardened
- 13. When decorate as required
